Job Description: " I manage the US Army Corps of Engineers Willamette Valley wildlife program. We design, implement, and monitor wildlife populations (primarily sensitive, non-game species) at our 13 dams and reservoirs through the Willamette Valley. In addition, we summarize and analyze wildlife data to help inform and guide future management of sensitive species."
